

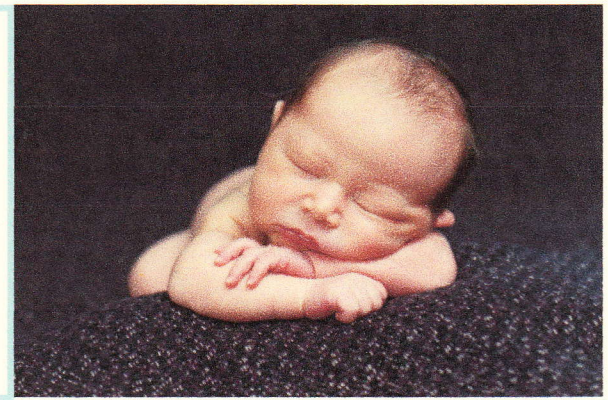

Divisions & Rules:

Kindergarten	6th-8th grade
1st-2nd grade	9th-10th grade
3rd-5th grade	11th-12th grade

NEW Category:

Computer Generated Drawings 9th-12th grade

Drawings must **incorporate the contest theme**. All artwork must be original, and must be on paper **no larger than 8 1/2 in. x 11 in.**

Essay Contest

Divisions & Rules:

5th-6th grades	200-300 words
7th-9th grades	300-400 words
10th-12th grades	400-500 words

Essays will be judged on general organization, grammar, clarity of message, originality and incorporation of theme
